Overview of Youth Homelessness

- 2022 PIT Count:
- Ages 0–24: 832 individuals (97 under 18, 735 ages 18–24)
- 9 sheltered youth, 88 unsheltered under 18
- 161 sheltered, 574 unsheltered ages 18–24

- 2024 Trend:
- Youth under 25 experiencing homelessness decreased to 428 (from 880 in 2022).

Progress & Impact

- Youth homelessness decreased from 880 (2022) to 428 (2024).
- Overall homelessness down 3%, unsheltered down 11% (2024 PIT data).

Spread the Word

Providers should be communicating with the Covenant House CES and/or TAY Peer Navigation team when working with TAY.

There are various youth services offered that many are unaware of because they only work directly with the adult population. Encouraging other HRCs and providers to connect youth coming through the front door to youth services would help a lot.

There is often a lower threshold for eligibility for TAY resources. A lower assessment score is still eligible for TAY resources.

Data Quality Reminder

- For TH and RRH joint projects that all jointcomponent clients' TH enrollments should reflect the actual dates they are residing in TH and RRH enrollments should reflect the full time they are receiving assistance from the joint-component project, whether they are receiving RRH rental assistance or not.
- There are additional data fields collected to better understand the youth homeless population.
